EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH INVESTMENT (EWI) PROGRAM



We are pleased to announce the graduation of our second class of diverse women. Our last session was held in June and each participant received a \$1,140 check to begin their personal investment journey. Special thanks to our three-volunteer instructors Nancy Stich, Kathy Rosenblath, and Mindy Rodriguez for helping to make our year a success. Our next class will begin in 2025, and plans are already underway to identify Year-Three participants. Below are testimonials from this year's class.

"Before your program, I was struggling with financial management. I had a couple of high interest loans and a few credit cards with utilization over 50%, and little to nothing in emergency savings. By the end of your program, I had paid off 3 loans (one with an extremely high interest rate, total of the 3 loans \$7,000), and saved up to \$9,600 in emergency funds. I was able to do so despite being off work for 8 weeks due to a medical situation. The monthly meetings were very informative as I learned about investing for the future, credit card debt and management, loan management, and overall healthy financial management. There is no way I would have accomplished what I accomplished had I not been part of the program. Thank you so much!!!!" SCHOOL FOOD PANTRY PROGRAM



The 2023-2024 school year was a huge success for the children in our Food Pantry Program. In addition to our monthly food and drink deliveries, we were able to obtain some items from the Food Bank of Northwest Louisiana. Over 5,000 students are represented in the schools we serve, and we were able to provide over 45,000 snacks this school year. We were also successful in providing boxes of food for the college food pantries on the LSUA and UWF campuses.

However, the 2024-2025 school year will bring several changes to our program. Two of the schools we served have closed and the students have

been reassigned to other campuses. We will not add additional schools at this time but will not rule out the possibility for the future. We have also decided to change how the program is operated.

When the Food Pantry Program originated in 2019, it was run by Children's Miracle Network (CMN) as a grant program. Remember, the spring of that school year is when everything shut down due to COVID. CMN asked us to take over running the program, which we agreed to do. For the past three years, we have bought and distributed the food items to the various schools we serve. During that time, we have had technical difficulties, problems with deliveries, and costs increases.

After getting input from some of the principals and coordinators of the program, we have decided to return to the original format of a grant program. Checks will be delivered to the schools at the beginning of each semester. The schools may then purchase the items for their schools from wherever they wish. We are asking that they email us copies of the receipts for our records.

Coordination with the Food Bank of Northwest Louisiana will continue. As we find items the schools can use, we will be happy to pick them up and deliver them.




WAREHOUSE AND SHIPPING

Over the last six to nine months, we have made several international shipments. Our largest was an eighteen-wheeler trailer full of medical equipment that was shipped to Hospital Sister Mission Outreach (HSMO) in Springfield, Illinois and then several pieces of that equipment went into a container that recently arrived in Nigeria.

Additionally, we successfully sent multiple shipments of supplies to our Christian Community Clinic in Haiti.

Out of the warehouse, we were able to share multiple shelving units and a pallet jack with the local food bank for their work with community food pantries. We delivered 30-plus boxes of medical supplies to the LSUA Nursing and Allied Health programs. Finally, as a last act of emptying the warehouse, we donated the warehouse cart to David Raines Community Health Centers.

By the end of October, we plan to close our warehouse services down. We will continue to send small boxes of medical supplies to our Haitian clinics, but we will no longer collect major medical equipment donations. We will, however, continue to work with HSMO and other partners to meet the needs of international ministries.



DROIDS & DRAGONS TRIVIA FUNDRAISER



This year's 5th annual Droids and Dragons event was our most successful to date! We raised about \$43,000. 60% of these monies went to the Food Bank of Northwest Louisiana for the school backpack program, while 40% went to support our School Pantry Program.
